Welcome : The President presided over the meeting and extended a warm welcome to all the members who joined the meeting either in person or on line.

Minutes of meeting:

- 1) Dr. Diwan congratulated the team for successful organization of 2nd IVC Seminar at Daman on 16th May 2025.
 - a. Dr. Diwan opened the discussion with the progress of IVC in organizing seminars to reach to the industry. Members shared their views on the joint seminars with IPI as well as IVC seminars at Jalgaon and Daman. It was agreed by the members that IVC

should prefer to organize seminars rather than joint seminars as the purposes of IPI and IVC are different. IVC Seminars were well appreciated due to contents which is attracting the delegates.

- b. Dr. Abhijit Patil appraised the committee members of participation of delegates in both Jalgaon (253 total and 160 paid delegates) and Daman seminars (215 total and 175 paid delegates). Also, final accounts were shared to understand that with huge response and limited sponsorship, IVC was able to settle all expenses with limited gains.
- c. It was also highlighted that IVC seminars resulted in good response towards membership.

2) Membership updates were discussed to understand the increase in members.

- a. Dr. Patil appraised the committee that during Oct. 2024 to June 2025 about 22 members were added and the final number reached to 55.
- b. It was understood that total number of 55 includes resin producer (4 no), Additive mfr/suppliers (16 no), Machinery mfr (4 no) Processors (23 no), Trade business (3 no), Recycling (1 no) Regulatory organization (1 no) and Honorary members (3 no).
- c. All members agreed to take the number to at least 100 targeting different categories with major focus on processors.
- d. **It is proposed that each committee member can target 5 companies/organizations and progress can be reviewed every 2 months. Dr. Abhijit to co-ordinate with the officials of organizations (who showed interest) taking lead from the members.**
- e. Sh. G K Saxena proposed to review the fees structure for small enterprises which was agreed by the committee and would be considered over a period of time.

3) Restructuring of Working Sub-committees

- a. IVC has different sub-committees like Website Committee/Membership/Policy Advocacy/Conference or Webinar committee. Each committee includes 3-4 members who are responsible to operate for the necessary activities.
- b. Members agreed to rearrange the committees based on the activities like Newsletter/BIS related activities/Educational interactions etc.
- c. It is also proposed to have new members on sub-committees for better involvement of new members and acknowledge their contribution.

4) Nomination of Mr. Pijush Burman as a Management Committee member

- a. Mr. Pijush Burman from Cooldeck Industries Pvt. Ltd. Took untiring efforts to make the Daman seminar successful. With his dynamic nature and enthusiasm, IVC could reach to the larger audience in Daman and areas around Daman.
- b. Mr. Pijush also helping IVC to get more and more members. He is spreading voice of IVC towards various industry stakeholders which is resulting in increase in member base.

- c. Mr. Pijush showed his interest to be a member of IVC management committee and it was accepted by all members of IVC management committee.

6) Letter to Govt. Agencies for adoption of PVC and O-PVC pipes.

- a. Dr. Abhijit Patil had a discussion with Mr. Haresh Pillay of Sintex BAPL regarding the letter. Mr. Haresh proposed that IVC being a neutral body can write a letter to different Govt. bodies/agencies executing water projects across the country.
- b. The proposed letter can be sent to promote the PVC and O-PVC pipes highlighting techno-commercial benefits of these pipes.
- c. Members from the processing industry would be sharing the details of the list of authorities from the subject Govt. agencies. It is also thought that this interaction would also be useful to have better interactions between actual end user and the industry (during IVC seminars).
